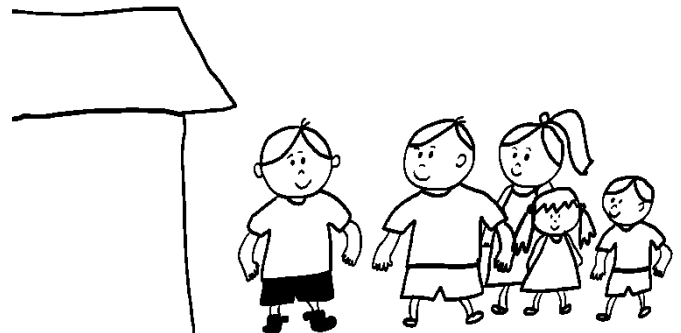

When Stanley looked down at the barn, he got a surprise! There were a lot of people, outside Farmer Bill's shed.

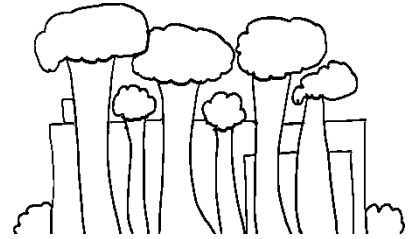
When Stanley flew down to the barn, to see what was happening. He heard Farmer Bill say that everything in the shed, was included in the sale of the farm.

But the next day, Lolly was not happy. Her mother said she could **not** go to the toy shop.

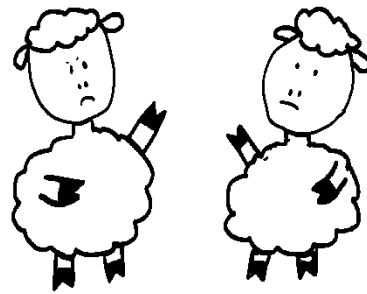
Lolly's mother promised to take Lolly to the toy shop, if she wore her glasses all day, without complaining.

But Lolly thought that it would be very hard to wear her glasses all day, without complaining.

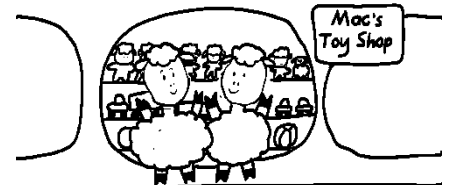
